HEBRON LANDSCAPING & PLAYGROUND COMMITTEE MEETING DRAFT MINUTES – 11/10/22, 12/8/22 accepted with amendments DATE: January 19, 2023

Present: Fred Kohout, Chair; Bif (Raymond) Wisner, Vice Chair, Mavis Brittelli; Paul Falzarano; Garry Lahey (absent); Barbara Kohout, Secretary;

Meeting called to order at 5pm. Ended 6:44pm. (Meeting from 1/12/23 postponed to today)

- Administrative Review
 - Spreadsheet: Tree Survey Update (11/15/22); Proposed Trees-Cost List, Committee Member's Contact Information;

Review of Select Board Charge for the Committee including updating the Tree Survey (of 2016), discussing desirable trees to replant, potentially adding a playground, renovating or replacing the Gazebo and disguising the wellhead;

<u>Review of 2016 Town Common Tree Survey</u>

Completed a Hebron Common site visit (12/15/22) then Tree Survey Update Spreadsheet (V1) completed and reviewed today;

No response from Hebron Newsletter item in December looking for persons responsible for 3 new trees planted on the Common; need to identify date and by whom;

Detailed specific trees to be removed (3), and missing trees (9);

• Discussion of specific new trees (6-8):

Since the White Birch is the NH State Tree, it is a good choice; Mavis offered to donate White Birch saplings from her property if cost/benefit is reasonable; Other trees to consider (at least 2.5 – 3" in diameter): Red Maple--Autumn Blaze & October Glory, Northern Red Oak, Pin Oak, European Beech & White Kousa Dogwood; Scarlet Oak (hardy, colorful);

Possible Shrubs: Dappled Willow, Japanese Red Maple, Varigated Red Twig; Hosta; Decided against more Sugar Maples as there are already 6 and the most expensive; deleted more Flowering Crab as there are already 4 trees;

Daffodils: Planted already by Kohouts (Fall 2022) in 4 locations around rocks on the Common;

- <u>Cost Estimate Trees Purchase</u>: by Marc Braley, new Trees (6-8): range \$4500-5,000; TLC estimate pending;
- <u>Cost estimates for Tree and Stumps Removal</u>: Ariel \$2300; John Faucher, TLC and BartlettTree Experts, estimates pending;
- <u>Town Building Emergency Generator</u>: Recommend painting White to match building (currently orange);

• <u>Gazebo</u>:

Consider moving current Gazebo to near Hebron Police/Fire Building or new Community Center; requires roof and other repairs;

Recommend new construction, enlarging from current 14 ft octagon to up to 20 ft; Reviewed Rumney DIY Gazebo Project design and budget; Cost in 2016 @ \$18K; 2023 Cost estimates for new 20 ft octagonal design: \$30-35K; Will need Warrant Article;

Playground Discussion:

Concerns were discussed including significant costs to build and insure, need for extensive review and planning for construction and safety considerations (too near roads, need for rubber mulch \$800/100cu ft), possible limited use during only Gazebo functions (a few weekends seasonally) and one Hebron Fair day (July); evaluate need for use;

NOTE: Need to seek additional guidance for planning from Select Board;

- <u>Wellhead Cover</u>: Discussed options for covering with variety of materials (granite, blocks, or wood) and design; cost range ~ \$1000-2000; option to have running water access (seasonal); consider including cost with Gazebo Warrant Article;
- <u>Action Items</u>:
 - 1. Final decision for new tree selections on Town Common plot plan; include water lines on plot plan (contact John Fischer);
 - 2. Research Gazebo variety of designs and obtain cost estimates from Fifth Room, Reeds Ferry, and other local Contractors as alternative DIY builders;
 - 3. Review plot plan and new trees/shrubs proposal with Historic Committee, Hebron Fair Committee and Community Library Building Committee;
 - 4. Need cost estimates for ongoing landscaping maintenance, including tree trimming and fertilization;
 - Lawn Care: Newfound Lawncare estimate: five annual fertilizations \$4200, plus \$3000 to include lime, aeration & overseeding; Total \$7200;
 - 6. Timeline: Prepare final HCLPC Proposal to Select Board by no later than early March 2023;
